Pomerania – Land by the Sea

14,000 years of eventful history on the southern Baltic coast on both sides of the Oder river are presented in the Pomeranian State Museum between the former Franciscan church and the city wall – in an award-winning ensemble of buildings that impressively combines Gothic, Neoclassical and contemporary architecture.

The formation of the Pomeranian landscape can be experienced: from millions of years old geological profiles over amber to the effects of the Ice Age on the landscape.





A variety of exhibits paint a diverse picture of the development of Pomerania since the first hunters and gatherers roamed here. A two kilo gold neck ring from the turmoil of the Migration Period has an especially exciting find history. An impressive highlight is the unique Croy tapestry measuring 30 square metres, a testimony to the high culture at the court of the House of Griffin, the Pomeranian ruling dynasty.



The Thirty Years' War raged terribly. Afterwards, Sweden and Brandenburg ruled different parts of Pomerania for almost 200 years. Finally, during the Prussian era, fishing villages became fashionable spas. The decora-

tive vase of Eldena, gifted to the director of the State and Agricultural Academy in Eldena by his grateful students, presents itself impressive.

The 20th century, with its wars, multiple system changes and massive population exchange, was perhaps the greatest turning point in the history of the region. Finally, the name Pomerania almost completely disappeared in the GDR. It is only in the last 30 years that the region has increasingly returned to structures that have grown over centuries. The exhibition shows the many facets of these fractions and continuities.

In addition to significant objects, the exhibition is complemented by intricate media stations and installations that offer biographical approaches to individual themes.







Caspar David Friedrich and more ...

The gallery of the Pomeranian State Museum will be redesigned over the next few years with a focus on Romanticism. A new building will be added, the "chapel", which is intended to put visitors in the right mood for experiencing Caspar David Friedrich's work.

During the construction period, the "public favourites" of our high-quality collection are exhibited in the "Konventshaus". Frans Hals, Caspar David Friedrich and Vincent van Gogh continue to look forward to your visit together with new "neighbours"!
